Other top lots in the sale include <u>Gilbert Stuart</u>, <u>George Washington</u>, which sold for \$975,000 against an estimate of \$200,000-300,000, <u>Joshua Johnson, A Pair of Portraits: Boy with Squirrel</u> <u>and Girl with Dog</u>, which realized \$495,000 against an estimate of \$100,000-

150,000.

Chinese Export Art Featuring the Tibor Collection, Part II totaled \$1,923,375 with 88% sold by value and 79% sold by lot. The top lot of the sale was <u>A Pair of Famille</u> <u>Rose Soldier Vases and Covers, Qianlong Period (1736-1795)</u>, from the Tibor Collection, which realized \$250,000. Additional top lots from the Tibor Collection included <u>A Rare Early Mexican Market Blue and White Jar, Wanli Period, circa 1600</u>, which achieved \$193,750, and <u>A Large Ruby and Famille Rose Five-Piece Garniture,</u> <u>Yongzheng/Early Qianlong Period, circa 1730-1740</u>, which realized \$162,500.

Outsider Art totaled \$3,312,125 with 99% sold by value and 98% sold by lot, surpassing over twice the total low estimate. The top lot of the sale was Bill Traylor, *Man on White, Woman on Red / Man with Black Dog,* double-sided, 1939-1942 from The Collection of Alice Walker, which realized \$507,000. Strong prices were also achieved for William Edmondson works including <u>Double-Handled Cup, 1930s</u>, which sold for \$175,000 against an estimate of \$4,000-6,000, and <u>Pair of Vessels, 1930s</u>, which sold for \$162,500, above its estimate of \$7,000-10,000.
