SPRING AUCTION HIGHLIGHTS



In celebration of the FIFA 2018 World Cup, Louis Vuitton was commissioned to produce a series of trunks, leather goods and accessories. On offer in the spring sale is **a FIFA World Cup Official Match Ball Monogram Trunk**, that contains replicas of the 13 official match balls used at World Cup tournaments since 1970, all specially created by Adidas. Of particular note is an additional 14th ball specially designed and made by Louis Vuitton, presented together in the trunk. With only 25 sets made for purchase worldwide, this trunk will undoubtedly spark intense competition among football and trunk lovers this May.

On offer is a Special Order Night Picnic Astronomy Telescope Monogram Trunk, designed By Patrick Louis Vuitton & the Japanese collector. It was produced back in 2014 to celebrate the 160th anniversary of the diplomatic mission of France in Japan. Supplemented with 1 professional astronomy telescope, 6 sets of champagne flutes, white porcelain plates, white napkins, forks, knives, tea spoons and dining spoons, and 1 large picnic cloth, all signed by Louis Vuitton, this exquisite trunk is the ideal companion for fashion enthusiasts for picnics and stargazing.

The **Stokowski Secretaire Monogram Trunk** was originally designed for celebrated British conductor Leopold Stokowski in 1929, whose jet-setting life prompted a special order to Louis Vuitton to produce a travelling office trunk for his voyages around the globe. This original trunk is illustrated on page 297 of the Louis Vuitton book, "100 Legendary Trunks".

To be presented at our Spring Auction is a reinvented version of the trunk with modern needs in mind, including numerous drawers and storage spaces for books, papers, a larger collapsible table and a folding stool, and everything else needed in a nomadic work station. The interior is exquisitely finished in straw marquetry and features the maison's LV initials, while the exterior is enveloped with its signature monogram canvas.

This iconic watch trunk is a true statement collectible for discerning watch and trunk collectors, who are admirers of the brand and its craftsmanship.

The brand worked with CIAV (International Center for the Glassworker's Art) to produce these dazzling ornaments with once obsolete glasswork techniques. This is a must-have for those who wish to celebrate the holidays with extravagance!

Covered in the signature Damier canvas that matches a traditional Japanese room, this **Special Order Japanese Tea Ceremony Damier Trunk** features numerous drawers with the collector's full set of tea ceremony utensils. Among these utensils, a pair of black tea bowls were custom made by the famed Japanese porcelain artist Kyosuke Hayashi, and was an auctioned lot from the Take Action Foundation X Louis Vuitton fundraising charity gala in 2010 with Christie's as the auction partner. The gala was hosted by Hidetoshi Nakata, the celebrated former football player and the director of the foundation.
